As many of you know, parts of Mexico face what some are calling the worst drought in 70 years. Crop yields last year were below normal and many farmers have already sold their cattle to generate income. Farmers that still have livestock must pay high prices for feed. For many, these are desperate times.

Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) has now set up a "drought response plan" where people can make donations to MCC and get receipted. Beyond that MCC is also collecting material aid that they plan to ship to Mexico. We have received a special permit that will allow us entry to Mexico with used clothing items. We are in the process of filling a semi-trailer of clothing, bedding, towels etc, things that can be bailed. We are also collecting shoes and winter boots which we will put into boxes. We are using the Plum Coulee MCC warehouse to pack and store the items till the semi is full. Items can be dropped off at the Plum Coulee Warehouse every Tuesday and Thursday as that is when they are bailing clothes. Volunteers are also needed to help with bailing.
